SERVICE CLASSIFICATION RIDER

Applicable to Service Classification Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 5

NET METERING FOR WIND AND SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC SYSTEMS

Eligibility:

A customer operating a qualifying wind or solar photovoltaic electric generator ("Customer-generator") located on the customer's side of the electric meter, used at the customer's residence or facility and in compliance with the provisions of this Rider is eligible for service hereunder.

The customer will be required to submit an application for service under this Rider and pay an application processing fee of \$100 at the time of application.

The customer will also be required to submit a signed Net Metering Agreement to the Company and the Company's execution of such Net Metering Agreement shall constitute approval for the customer to receive service hereunder.

Customer's generator shall have a rated capacity of no more than the lesser of 100kW or the current peak electric demand of the customer's residence or facility. Interconnection with the Company's system will be at the customer's expense and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the Net Metering Agreement. Interconnection costs shall be paid by the customer and shall be in addition to any line extension charge required to meet service requirements.

Metering and Billing:

Metering may be accomplished using a single meter to record the energy delivered by the Company to the customer and energy supplied by the customer to the Company. The Company shall be permitted to install a second meter, at its expense and with the customer's permission, to measure gross energy supplied by the customer's generator.

The Company will employ net energy metering to measure and charge for the net energy delivered by the Company as follows:

- (1) If the amount of energy delivered by the Company exceeds the amount of energy supplied to the Company (net purchase by customer) in a billing period, the customer will be billed for such net purchase at the rates specified in the customer's applicable Service Classification.

Metering and Billing: (Continued)

- (2) If the amount of energy supplied to the Company exceeds the amount of energy delivered by the Company (net sale by customer) during a billing period, that amount will be transferred to the next billing period and added to any sales by the customer in that billing period. At the end of each twelve-month period ("Annualized Period"), any cumulative net sale by a customer shall be purchased as described below.
 - (a) A net sale, by a customer purchasing Basic Generation Service from the Company, will be purchased by the Company at the New York Independent System Operator's Locational Based Marginal Price for the Hudson Valley Zone, averaged over the twelve-month period. A credit voucher will be issued to the customer for the amount resulting from such net sale. This credit shall be used to offset electric bills issued to the customer following the date the credit is issued.
 - (b) A net sale, by a customer purchasing Competitive Energy Supply, will be purchased by the customer's Electric Generation Supplier at its avoided cost of wholesale power.

When a customer-generator switches electric suppliers, the electric power supplier or basic generation service provider with whom service is terminating shall treat the end of the service period as if it were the end of the Annualized Period.

Interconnection Standards:

- (1) Customer-generators shall bear the cost of meeting all applicable safety and power quality standards including the Company's standards and standards approved by the National Electrical Code, Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, and accredited testing institutions, such as Underwriters Laboratories.

Interconnection Standards: (Continued)

- (2) Customer-generator facilities rated up to and including 10 kW, except for those facilities served by network distribution systems, shall comply with the Company's Interconnection Standards for Solar or Wind Electric Power Producing Facilities of 10 kW or Less in the State of New Jersey and all applicable safety and power quality standards approved by the National Electrical Code, Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, and accredited testing institutions, such as Underwriters Laboratories, and specifically IEEE Standard 929-2000.
- (3) Customer-generator facilities rated above 10 kW and not more than 100 kW, and those rated 10 kW and less and served by network distribution systems, shall comply with the Company's Interconnection Standards for Parallel Operation of Small-Size Generating Facilities 10 – 100 KiloWatts in the State of New Jersey and all applicable safety and power quality standards approved by the National Electrical Code, Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers and accredited testing laboratories, such as Underwriters Laboratories.
- (4) The Company may not require an eligible customer-generator whose system(s) meets the standards above to install additional controls, perform or pay for additional tests or purchase additional liability insurance.

Reporting:

The Company and Electric Generation Suppliers providing Competitive Energy Supply to the Company's customers shall each submit an annual report to the Board indicating the rated generating capacity owned and operated by its net metering customer-generators, the net kWh received from customer-generators and the aggregate value of net metering credits provided during the previous twelve months. Annual reports shall be due October 31st of each year for the period ending September 30th of each year.

Applicable to Service Classification No. 2 and 7

CURTAILABLE SERVICE

Any customer or group of cooperative customers which shall herein after be referred to as a customer, who takes service under Service Classification No. 2 or 7 of this Schedule and declares a portion or all of said customer's load to be curtailable in accordance with the following provisions shall be eligible to take and pay for such service under this Rider.

The Company shall provide at least four hours notice prior to each period of curtailment. Curtailment periods shall be limited to the calendar months of June, July, August and September, not more than 10 hours per occurrence and:

- a. 15 occurrences per year for Priority 1 Service; or
- b. 10 occurrences per year for Priority 2 Service.

A customer shall be required:

- a. to declare at least 250 kW as customer's curtailable load;
- b. to provide the names and telephone numbers of customer's representative and a backup representative to whom the Company shall provide notice of and instructions for each curtailment period;
- c. to ensure that such representative is available to receive notices and instructions between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., prevailing time, during the period June 1 to September 30; and
- d. to reduce customer's load in accordance with instructions given by the Company to customer's representative.

Service Type A

The initial term of service shall be one year. Service is renewable thereafter at one year increments.

A customer shall have fulfilled customer's obligation to reduce load if, during each curtailment period, customer's load measured in kW does not

exceed the level specified in the instructions provided to customer in advance of each curtailment period. This level shall be determined by the Company by subtracting the amount of load declared by customer to be curtailable from the customer's highest fifteen-minute integrated demand measured in kW during the hours of 10:00 a.m. through 10:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, excluding holidays as specified in Service Classification No. 7, for the thirty-day period preceding the beginning of the curtailment period by no more than five days. A grace period of 10 hours per year shall be provided to each customer for which the following penalty shall not apply.

If during a curtailment period, a customer's load exceeds the maximum level determined as provided for above and as included in the instructions given to customer's representative, customer shall be obligated to pay a penalty for each kwh used in excess of the maximum demand (in kW) specified times the number of hours in the curtailable period at 42.7 cents per kWh for Priority 1 Service or 34.1 cents per kWh for Priority 2 Service. A customer shall be obligated to pay such penalty for failure to curtail load even if the Company has not notified the customer's representative provided that the Company has taken all reasonable steps to notify the customer.

Service Type B – With Selfgeneration

A customer shall have the option of selecting a 1, 3 or 5 year initial term and on not less than thirty-days written notice (prior to the end of such term) may elect a succeeding term of 1, 3 or 5 years.

A customer shall have fulfilled customers obligation to reduce load if, during each curtailment period, customer operates customer's generation facilities at or above a capacity level in kW, as measured by the Company's meter, equal to customer's declared curtailable load in kW. A grace period of 10 hours per year shall be provided to each customer for which the following penalty shall not apply.

A customer's obligation to provide service hereunder shall be suspended during all times that service normally supplied to said customer by the Company is interrupted, for whatever reason.

Service hereunder shall not be available to customers providing service to the Company under a separate contract.

The customer and the Company shall agree as to the operating mode, interconnection and equipment specifications as set forth in the Specifications for Electric Installations, which are subject to Commission review and available from the Company at customer's request.

The customer shall be responsible for paying for all interconnection costs including payment for work done by the Company on its facilities solely to accommodate service to customer under this service classification.

Upon request of a customer electing either a 3 or 5-year term of service, the Company will pay the interconnection costs, limited to \$100 per kW of curtailable load and will reduce by one-twelfth of those interconnection costs, the amount due to customer in each of the first twelve billing months for which the Company makes a payment under the

“Credit for Curtailable Load”. The customer shall provide to the Company copies of all invoices for labor and materials and any other charges the Company is to pay under this provision.

The Company will own, install and maintain the metering equipment necessary, as determined by the Company, to measure service supplied hereunder. The initial cost of installing the metering equipment shall be considered an “Interconnection Cost”.

The customer shall provide advance notice to the Company of any planned changes in customer’s facilities that would alter the operating mode, customer’s demand and/or energy requirements or customer’s generation capacity. No significant changes shall be made without agreement by the Company. The Company shall have the right to inspect its facilities located on customer’s property and customer’s facilities at all reasonable times.

Credit for Curtailable Load

In addition for paying for service under this Schedule at the rates and charges of the applicable service classification, a customer shall receive a credit in each of the billing months of June, July, August and September equal to customer’s declared curtailable load in kW times:

In accordance with P.L. 1997, c. 192 (the "energy tax reform statute"), provision for the New Jersey Corporation Business Tax has been included in all charges applicable under this tariff except those applicable under the provisions of the Company's Fuel Adjustment Clause and Demand-Side Management Adjustment as described on Leaf Nos. 17, 17A, 17B, 17C, 17D, 17F and 17G of the General Information Section (the "Base Tariff Rates") by multiplying the Base Tariff Rates in effect immediately prior to January 1, 1998 by the factor 1.008527. BUILDING UTILIZATION RIDER

Applicable To:

Customers receiving service under Service Classification No. 2 or 7. This rider is not available to those customers taking high voltage distribution service.

Character of Service:

Commitments for service under this provision will be made available to qualifying customers from May 1, 2008 until December 31, 2010. Customers must commence service hereunder within 24 months of the date of commitment.

Eligibility:

Each customer will be required to sign an application for service under the Building Utilization Rider. The application must be submitted prior to leasing or purchasing vacant space. Upon verification of eligibility, the Company will approve the application and provide the customer with a written commitment for service hereunder.

To be eligible, a customer must lease or purchase space that has been vacant for a minimum of three months prior to such time as the customer submits an application for service hereunder, as determined by the Company. The total leased or purchased building space must equal or exceed 7,500 square feet. The space must require no significant additional investment in facilities by the Company defined as 50% of the estimated first year net annual revenue.

To be eligible, the customer must operate a business therein which is classified by the North American Industry Classification System (1997 edition or supplements thereto) as Manufacturing (Sector 31-33), Wholesale Trade (Sector 42), Transportation and Warehousing (Sector 48-49), Information (Sector 51), Finance and Insurance (Sector 52), Real Estate, Rental and Leasing (Sector 53), Professional, Scientific and Technical Services (Sector 54), Management of Companies and Enterprises (Sector 55), Administrative, Support, Waste Management and Remediation (Sector 56).

To be eligible, the customer must qualify for, receive, and provide the Company with suitable documentation substantiating the receipt of a comprehensive package of economic incentives conferred by the local municipality or state authorities and including substantial financial assistance or a substantial tax incentive program designed to maintain or increase employment levels in the service area.

Eligibility: (Continued)

To be eligible, the customer must be adding permanent full-time employees to their payroll at the site receiving service under the Building Utilization Rider. Relocation or consolidation of New Jersey based employees, without employment growth, will not qualify. By December 31 of each of the three years a customer receives service under this Rider, the customer shall submit to the Company, a letter detailing how many additional jobs it has added for that year and its current employee level. A customer failing to provide this information by December 31 of each year shall no longer be eligible for service under this Rider.

The Company shall not be obligated to approve additional applications in a calendar year if applications representing over 500,000 square feet of total leased or purchased building space have been accepted in such calendar year.

Credit:

For the customer's newly leased or purchased space, as determined by the Company, a credit will be applied to the customer's monthly electric bills for 36 consecutive billing months. The monthly credit will be determined by applying the rates contained in the following schedules to the total energy in kWh delivered by the Company.

Customers receiving service under Service Classification No. 2 or 7. This rider is not available to those customers taking high voltage distribution service.

Character of Service:

Commitments for service under this provision will be made available to qualifying customers from May 1, 2008 until December 31, 2010. Customers must commence service hereunder within 24 months of the date of such commitment.

Eligibility:

Eligible customers are those constructing new facilities or expanding existing facilities subject to the requirements of this Rider.

Each customer will be required to sign an application for service under the Business Expansion Rider. The application must be submitted prior to construction. Upon verification of eligibility, the Company will approve the application and provide the customer with a written commitment for service hereunder.

To be eligible, the area of the customer's newly constructed facility or expansion of an existing facility must equal or exceed 7,500 square feet. Facility expansions must require no significant additional investment in facilities by the Company defined as 50% of the estimated first year net annual revenue.

To be eligible, a customer must be locating, relocating or expanding into a Designated Growth Area as defined in General Information Section No. 15.

To be eligible, a customer's newly constructed facility or expansion of an existing facility must be classified by the North American Industry Classification System (1997 edition or supplements thereto) as Manufacturing (Sector 31-33), Wholesale Trade (Sector 42), Transportation and Warehousing (Sector 48-49), Information (Sector 51), Finance and Insurance (Sector 52), Real Estate, Rental and Leasing (Sector 53), Professional, Scientific and Technical Services (Sector 54), Management of Companies and Enterprises (Sector 55), Administrative, Support, Waste Management and Remediation (Sector 56).
